FAMILY TEACHER CONFERENCES

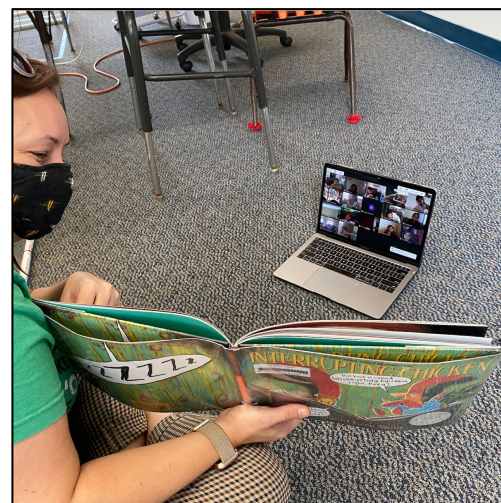
It's that time of the year again! We are planning and preparing for our Family Teacher Conferences on October 29 & 30, 2020.

Please complete the form by midnight Sunday, October 18, 2020. Your teacher will be sending out the confirmed times by Thursday, October 22, 2020.

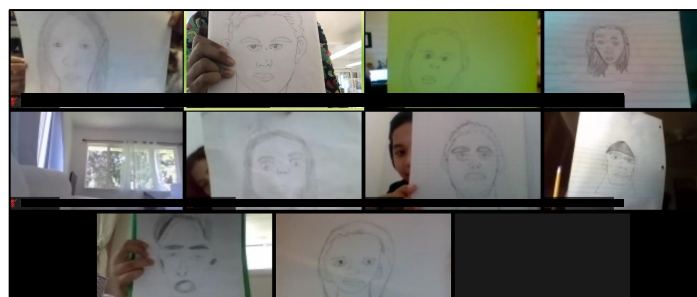
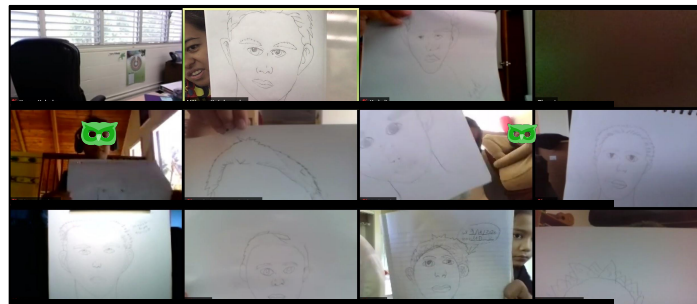


QUARTER 1 VIRTUAL LEARNING HIGHLIGHTS!
